WHEREAS the King has been graciously pleased, by Licence under the Royal Signet and Sign Manual, to give and grant unto George Gilbert Grogan, of Johnstown Castle, in the County of Wexford, Esq. His Royal Permission and Authority, that he may (in testimony of grateful respect for the memory of his kinsman, Samuel Morgan, late of the City of Waterford, Esq. deceased, and in compliance with an injunction contained in the last Will and Testament of the said deceased,) take and use the surname of Morgan, in addition to and after that of Grogan, and also use and bear the Armorial Ensigns of Morgan, quartered with those of Grogan; provided that such His Majesty's concession and Royal Declaration be first recorded, and the Arms duly exemplified in the Office of Ulster King of Arms of all Ireland; otherwise the said Royal Licence and Authority to be void and of none effect:

Now these are to declare and certify, that the same have been recorded and exemplified accordingly.
