Dublin Castle, April 15, 1844.

THE Queen has been pleased, by Warrant under the royal signet and sign manual, to give and grant to Richard Joynt, of Banagher, in the King's County, Esq. Her Majesty's royal licence and authority, that he and his issue may take the name of Annesley, in addition to and after that of Joynt, and to bear the arms of Annesley, in compliance with the desire, during his lifetime often expressed, and out of grateful respect to the memory of his maternal uncle, Charles Annesley, late of Ballysax, in the County of Kildare, Esq. deceased: Provided Her Majesty's royal concession and declaration be recorded in the Office of Ulster, King of Arms of all Ireland, to the end that the officers of arms there, and all others upon occasion, may take full notice, and have knowledge thereof; which has been done accordingly.
